Our future landscape is not static and will definitely change, particularly with the impact of automation, IOT and the 4th Industrial Revolution (4IR). Using strategic foresight tools and consultations with over 100 stakeholders, a number of identified driving forces likely to impact the future of jobs are presented for the audience to discuss and prioritize.
